6th Sunday in Lent: Palm Sunday / Te Rātapu Tuaono o Rēneti: te Rātapu Nikau

Kia ora Cathedral Whānau,

Today is the start of Holy Week as we celebrate Palm Sunday, when Jesus entered Jerusalem to shouts of "Hosanna", riding on a donkey fulfilling the words of the prophet Zechariah, "Lo your King comes to you; triumphant and victorious is He, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt. The foal of a donkey." (Zechariah 9:9).

Although shouts of hosanna give the impression of celebration, we are very much aware of what lies ahead for Jesus because only days later, those shouts turn to cries of "Crucify him".

I do want to take this opportunity to thank Nigel Weeks, Paul Chan and the choir for the effort they are putting into our Easter services, especially with learning the pieces from "The Crucifixion" by John Stainer. The choir will be joined by Tenor Soloist Ewen Griffiths who is from Nelson but is now living in Wellington, and I am singing the Bass solo part.

I hope you can join us in our Easter services as we take this journey together so that we can remember and celebrate the cornerstone of our faith. Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come in glory.

Finally, please note that there is no evening service on Easter Sunday. This will return on April 27 with Evening Prayer with Hymns at the new winter time of 5pm, and Evensong will return on Sunday May 4 at 5pm.

Untie it and bring it

here. ³¹ If anyone asks you, "Why are you untying it?" just say this: "The Lord needs it." ³² So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. ³³ As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, 'Why are you untying the colt?' ³⁴ They said, 'The Lord needs it.' ³⁵ Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. ³⁶ As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. ³⁷ As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, ³⁸ saying, 'Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! 

- ⁸ A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. ⁹ The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting, 'Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!' When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, 'Who is this?' ¹¹ The crowds were saying, 'This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee.'


