Kia ora Cathedral Whānau,

We had an amazing beginning to our Cathedral Christmas Season with the start of the Christmas Tree Festival. This week saw the final touches to a huge effort by our Christmas Tree Festival Committee: Joc Smith, Chris and Judith Fitchett, Erin Beatson, David Lucas, Janet Brown and John Collyns, and Michael Levy and Kate Mann. Many thanks for all your effort that is putting a smile on so many faces as people come and see the trees.

A feature of our Festival and also the Season of Advent that we have now entered, is the focus on symbols that remind us of the Jesus story. Let's start with the Christmas Tree itself. The image of a green tree or wreath goes as far back as ancient Egypt as a sign of eternal life, but the real origins of Christmas trees as we know them are rooted in present-day Germany during the Middle Ages. Green fir trees with apples tied on it were part of the "Paradise Plays" that were performed to celebrate the feast day of Adam and Eve, which fell on Christmas Eve, and represented the Biblical tree of knowledge.

Later the tree was decorated with apples, flour-paste wafers, tinsel and gingerbread. But traditions of the Christmas Tree changed with a picture of Queen Victoria and Prince Albert and their children gathering around a Christmas tree with presents underneath published in 1848. And in modern times, in December 1964, TIME magazine heralded a new Christmas trend: artificial trees.

During Advent, we use the greenery in the form of the Advent Wreath and other symbols to remind us of all that God has done for us. The circle of the wreath reminds us of God, who is eternal and offers endless mercy. The green speaks of the hope we have in God, of renewal, newness and eternal life. We also use candles to symbolise the light of God coming into the world through the birth of Jesus and our continued journey towards Christmas. The four outer candles remind us of four weeks of waiting and preparation, which in turn represent the four centuries between the Prophet Malachi and the Birth of Christ. Today is the first Sunday of Advent and we light the first violet candle - the candle of HOPE (sometimes called the "Prophet's candle"), which reminds us of the hope we have in Christ, the hope that the Prophets spoke of.

May all these symbols remind us of the true meaning of Christmas and through them, may we hear God speak to us through the message of the Angels to the Shepherds:

> "to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord".

It is Jesus who bring us eternal life as symbolized by the green tree. Jesus is the one who shows us God's goodness and love as symbolized by the presents and decorations. And it is Jesus who is God's gift to us – the true light of the world.






