Kia ora Cathedral Whanau,

Over the past 2 weeks, I have been so very proud of our Cathedral whānau as we have supported our wider Nelson community after the death of Senior Sergeant Lyn Fleming. The Cathedral response began with our flag at half-mast and the setting up of condolence books in the Cathedral, an initiative begun by Rev Steve using his experience both in ministry and in policing. Six books have been filled at the Cathedral.

On Thursday we opened the Cathedral to the Nelson Public so that we could all gather in honour of Lyn's life and service in our community and watch the live-streamed funeral service. We had 220 people come along and people commented how much they appreciated the opportunity to watch the service. I would like to thank the Cathedral staff team (especially Mark and David on Tech) along with the Diocesan staff who came along to help.

As I reflect on what it means to be a Cathedral in the heart of a city, the events of the past two weeks remind me of how a Cathedral functions – as a place "were the peace of God which passes all understanding" is present in all circumstances and is felt by people as they come in to sit, pray, or simply be still, and for many light a candle. For me this was tangible on Thursday simply by being in the Cathedral and ending our time together with a short blessing – both of which reminded us of God's love.

But as the Diocese focuses this year of evangelism, I am also reminded about how we as a Cathedral share the good news about Jesus. Ours so often, is a ministry of presence where we are present and available in times of need. As Rev Steve commented to me, in our whole Cathedral response over the past two weeks we have done what has felt right to do in meeting the needs of our wider community at this difficult time. It is in being present that further opportunities arise for even deeper conversations about Jesus as we build relationships and trust with people. And so often, it is what we do rather than what we say that communicates the love of God to all.

¹Now a man from the house of Levi went and married a Levite woman. ² The woman conceived and bore a son; and when she saw that he was a fine baby, she hid him for three months. ³ When she could hide him no longer she got a papyrus basket for him, and plastered it with bitumen and pitch; she put the child in it and placed it among the reeds on the bank of the river. ⁴ His sister stood at a distance, to see what would happen to him.⁵ The daughter of Pharaoh came down to bathe at the river, while her attendants walked beside the river. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her maid to bring it. ⁶ When she opened it, she saw the child. He was crying, and she took pity on him. 'This must be one of the Hebrews' children,' she said. ⁷ Then his sister said to Pharaoh's daughter, 'Shall I go and get you a nurse from the Hebrew women to nurse the child for you?' ⁸ Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Yes.'
