Dear Cathedralites

What a thrill it is today to welcome Dean Kanishka Raffel, the Dean of Sydney, to our Cathedral here in Nelson. Both Cathedrals in Nelson and Sydney are downtown, around the CBD and in wonderfully located positions. Kanishka has only fairly recently become Dean of Sydney Cathedral so he and I will have many stories to exchange!

On Wednesday the staff team had a profitable time together all day with singing, praying and planning. Our main emphasis was to look at the upcoming four week series on 'Growing the Cathedral' with three imperative words, 'Growing in liveliness', 'Growing in functionality' and 'Growing in Godliness'.

This weekend the reunion of the family of the descendants of Charles Mules and Laura Blundell is taking place. Charles was Bishop of Nelson from 1892-1912 following Bishop Suter. We wish this family well on this important reunion. We had a brief time at the Cathedral yesterday afternoon. Following on from that we had a service as part of the Prayers of Interfaith Week.

It was also nice to catch up with Chris Grantham – famous for his orange shirt when working in the missions.

This morning it is good to welcome Barry and Cecily Turner who are from my old parish at St. Christophers. It is lovely meeting up with folk from previous parishes.

One of the things that Jane Wulff has encouraged us to do as part of pastoral care is to support the lunch at the Back Alley Café. We have a Cathedral link there with those who are learning new skills in hospitality.

We rejoice as a Cathedral with the significant Consecration of the Auckland Cathedral which is taking place next Saturday. They have done extensive work on extending the Cathedral and it is now complete. We rejoice on their behalf.

Patsy decided to give Kina Reserve the miss last week so off we trekked with the caravan to Cable Bay camping ground. We did a four hour walk up and down the cliff face, through a forest circumnavigating a massive tree that blocked our way forward and then back

again. It was howling a gale the next day when we came home. You forgot to tell us about the winds in Nelson. You only told us about the sun!

I am personally astounded at our present political system where a party leader cannot even win his own seat and can make the nation wait for three weeks while making a decision whether to go one of either two ways. Exodus 33: 12-23 Moses said to the LORD, 'See, you have said to me, "Bring up this people"; but you have not let me know whom you will send with me. Yet you have said, "I know you by name, and you have also found favour in my sight." Now if I have found favour in your sight, show me your ways, so that I may know you and find favour in your sight. Consider too that this nation is your people.' He said, 'My presence will go with you, and I will give you rest.' And he said to him, 'If your presence will not go, do not carry us up from here. For how shall it be known that I have found favour in your sight, I and your people, unless you go with us? In this way, we shall be distinct, I and your people, from every people on the face of the earth.' The LORD said to Moses, 'I will do the very thing that you have asked; I will go with you, and I will be gracious to you, and I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and will show mercy on whom I will show mercy. But', he said, 'you cannot see my face; for no one shall see me and live.' Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace.

We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labour of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. For we know, brothers and sisters beloved by God, that he has chosen you, because our message of the gospel came to you not in word only, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction; just as you know what kind of people we proved to be among you for your sake. And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for in spite of persecution you received the word with joy inspired by the Holy Spirit, so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. For the word of the Lord has sounded forth from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but in every place where your faith in God has become known, so that we have no need to speak about it. For the people of those regions report about us what kind of welcome we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols, to serve a living and true God, and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead—Jesus, who rescues us from the wrath that is coming.

¹⁰ The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.

¹¹ 'I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹² The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. ¹³ The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. ¹⁴ I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, ¹⁵ just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶ I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. When you walk, your step will not be hampered; and if you run, you will not stumble. Keep hold of instruction; do not let go; guard her, for she is your life. Do not enter the path of the wicked, and do not walk in the way of evildoers. Avoid it; do not go on it; turn away from it and pass on. For they cannot sleep unless they have done wrong; they are robbed of sleep unless they have made someone stumble. For they eat the bread of wickedness and drink the wine of violence. But the path of the righteous is like the light of dawn, which shines brighter and brighter until full day.

1 John 3: 16-24

We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us— and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth

and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him.

And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

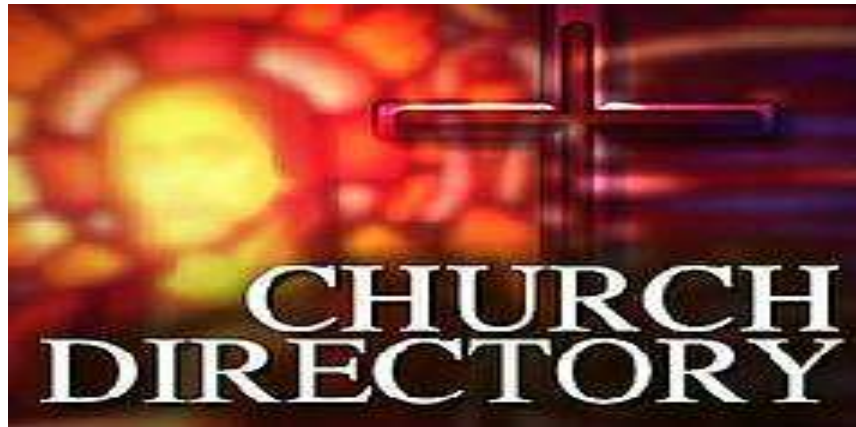
- Grape juice is available at communion.
