Dear Cathedralites

Patsy and I were biking the superb coastal route from Motueka to Kaiteriteri last Monday and as we were cycling along I asked her one of my favourite questions. What were we doing this time last year? I can never remember but she can. "Well", she said, We were actually at an interview in the Bishop's Office for the job of Dean of Nelson.

I remember the interview well! Twelve months later and here we are embarking on a four week series entitled "Growing the Cathedral."

One of the first requests I made upon being appointed Dean was to ask the then treasurer, Russell Smith, to produce graphs of the Cathedral attendance and giving during the past ten years. It was sobering to look at both graphs that went downwards.

Had these graphs been of a school, a business, or a sports club, then there would have been some very serious questions and meetings. So the pertinent question to ask is not "will we change"; that's a given, but "will we be

prepared to pay the cost of change". That's the biggy. You see if you keep on doing what we have always done we will always get what we always got.

When Bishop Richard appointed me as your Dean he did not have in mind for me to let those graphs continue in the same! A few months ago I met with other Deans who said, "Being Dean of a Cathedral is a fantastically easy job, if all you want to do is to enjoy the baubles of Office, wear the robes, enjoy being the Very Reverend, meeting with Mayors, Members of Parliament, being invited to preside at special services, all things I love doing.

But for me to be passive and ignore those graphs without doing anything about it would be to rob God, rob the Cathedral and rob myself. This I cannot do in all conscience, easy though it would be.

So the next four weeks will be definitive in terms of the next five years (God willing that I will be here as your Dean). Please note that there will be two opportunities each week for us to engage in discussions about all of this. I am

looking forward to those times, on the Wednesdays and Fridays.

As we look at the theme of 'Liveliness' this morning it is wonderful to be able to thank God for our Flower ladies. Every Sunday without fail we have the thrill of coming into the Cathedral adorned with flowers. These flowers speak liveliness and welcome.

Thank you so much for the ministry of all of you who have a talent in arranging flowers within this Cathedral. If you want to join that lively team I am sure Rosemary Bygate would love to hear from you. Phone 5485536.

Moses Dies and Is Buried in the Land of Moab

Then Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo, to the top of Pisgah, which is opposite Jericho, and the LORD showed him the whole land: Gilead as far as Dan, all Naphtali, the land of Ephraim and Manasseh, all the land of Judah as far as the Western Sea, the Negeb, and the Plain—that is, the valley of Jericho, the city of palm trees—as far as Zoar. The LORD said to him, ‘This is the land of which I swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, saying, “I will give it to your descendants”; I have let you see it with your eyes, but you shall not cross over there.’ Then Moses, the servant of the LORD, died there in the land of Moab, at the LORD’s command. He was buried in a valley in the land of Moab, opposite Beth-peor, but no one knows his burial place to this day. Moses was one hundred and twenty years old when he died; his sight was unimpaired and his vigour had not abated. The Israelites wept for Moses in the plains of Moab for thirty days; then the period of mourning for Moses was ended. Joshua son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom, because Moses had laid his hands on him; and the Israelites obeyed him, doing as the LORD had commanded Moses. Never since has there arisen a prophet in Israel like Moses, whom the LORD knew face to face. He was unequalled for all the signs and wonders that the LORD sent him to perform in the land of Egypt, against Pharaoh and all his servants and his entire land, and for all the mighty deeds and all the terrifying

displays of power that Moses performed in the sight of all Israel.

Paul’s Ministry in Thessalonica

You yourselves know, brothers and
sisters, that our coming to you was
not in vain, but though we had al-
ready suffered and been shamefully
maltreated at Philippi, as you know,
we had courage in our God to declare
to you the gospel of God in spite of
great opposition. For our appeal does

not spring from deceit or impure motives or trickery, but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the message of the gospel, even so we speak, not to please mortals, but to please God who tests our hearts. As you know and as God is our witness, we never came with words of flattery or with a pretext for greed; nor did we seek praise from mortals, whether from you or from others, though we might have made demands as apostles of Christ. But we were gentle among you, like a nurse tenderly caring for her own children. So deeply do we care for you that we are determined to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you have become very dear to us.

The Greatest Commandment

³⁴ When the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, ³⁵ and one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. ³⁶ 'Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?' ³⁷ He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." ³⁸ This is the greatest and first commandment. ³⁹ And a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." ⁴⁰ On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.'

The Value of Diligence

Send out your bread upon the waters, for after many days you will get it back. Divide your means seven ways, or even eight, for you do not know what disaster may happen on earth. When clouds are full, they empty rain on the earth; whether a tree falls to the south or to the north, in the place where the tree falls, there it will lie. Whoever observes the wind will not sow; and whoever regards the clouds will not reap. Just as you do not know how the breath comes to the bones in the mother's womb, so you do not know the work of God, who makes everything. In the morning sow your seed, and at evening do not let your hands be idle; for you do not know which will prosper, this or that, or whether both alike will be good. Light is sweet, and it is pleasant for the eyes to see the sun. Even those who live for many years should rejoice in them all; yet let them remember that the days of darkness will be many. All that comes is vanity. Rejoice, young man, while you are young, and let your heart cheer you in the days of your youth. Follow the inclination of your heart and the desire of your eyes, but know that for all these things God will bring you into judgment. Banish anxiety from your mind, and put away pain from your body; for youth and the dawn of life are vanity.

A Good Soldier of Christ Jesus

You then, my child, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus; and what you have heard from me through many witnesses entrust to faithful people who will be able to teach others as well. Share in suffering like a good soldier of Christ Jesus. No one serving in the army gets entangled in everyday affairs; the soldier's aim is to please the enlisting officer. And in the case of an athlete, no one is crowned without competing according to the rules. It is the farmer who does the work who ought to have the first share of the crops. Think over what I say, for the Lord will give you understanding in all things.

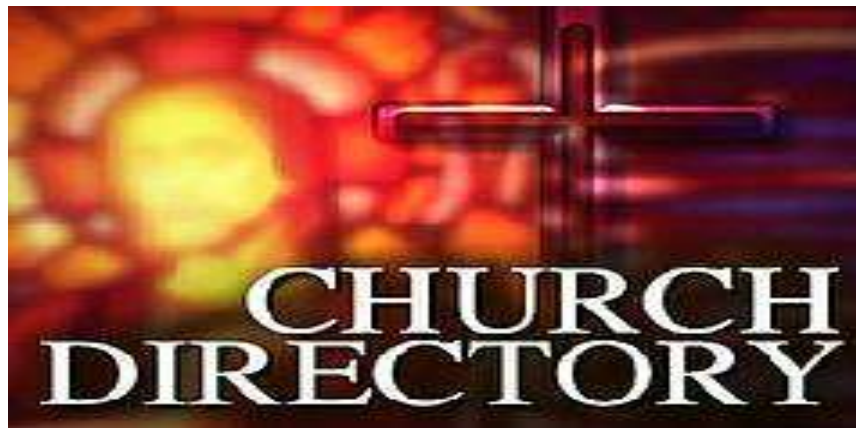
Service information
