Dear Cathedralites

This morning at 10am we welcome the Justices of the Peace who are here in Nelson for their Annual General Meeting. Justices of the Peace are known mainly for their character and integrity. They spend an enormous number of volunteer hours making life easier for others.

It has been a pretty full on week with the Holiday Programme every morning 10-12 while under John Laing who provides a wonderful programme on which we can be proud. I found a few extra muscles as I was in charge of the games, so if you see me limping you will know why.

My thanks to Father Steve for organising a really impressive Service here at the Cathedral for Passchendale. The Cathedral was involved in the Civic Service last Thursday which the Mayor, the RSA and others were represented. I loved the phrase Steve incorporated into the service. It is called the Kohima address "When you go home tell them of

us and stay - for your tomorrow, we gave our today"

Father Steve and I had a very productive meeting with Mayor Rachel earlier this week. We are all keen to see the Cathedral at the heart of this city and to co-ordinate various activities to make this happen.

It is 500 years since Martin Luther nailed the 95 thesis to the door of the church. Famously he is known as the one who highlighted the words of St. Paul "justification by faith alone."

We are privileged to have the Revd Dr Graeme O'Brien, Canon of the Cathedral, singing at our 10am service this morning. Graeme is well known in music circles.

It was a thrill to meet up with Sir Richard and Dianne Hadlee earlier in the week as they came to Nelson to promote the book that Richard has recently completed about his father

Walter, and the famous 1949 tour of England which took over 9 months. Walter Hadlee was a fine Christian man who belonged to the Methodist Church. I took his funeral a few years ago.

Tonight the Revd Simon Martin, Vicar of All Saints, will be preaching at both the 5.30 and 7pm services.

It will be an exciting weekend next week for the family of Bishop Mules, once Bishop of Nelson Diocese. The family will be having a reunion which include of returning to the Cathedral.

The Cathedral will be hosting this Saturday the interfaith World Day of Prayer Service from 4-5 on Saturday afternoon. Come and join us.

I am excited that next Sunday we will have preaching here at the

Cathedral, the Dean of Sydney, Kanishka Raffel. Make sure you invite others to the Service.

Meanwhile some wait with baited breath to see what sort of combination of parties we will have to rule our country over the next three years. Many I fear, have become totally uninterested with the antics of parties trying to stitch the deal to stay in power. Egos should never get in the way from our roles in society to be God honouring; to do the best for our people no matter what.

Pray for the staff day on Wednesday as we look at the upcoming series on 'Growing the Cathedral'. We will also be looking at the various opportunities coming up in 2018 and 19 to enable this Cathedral to grow.

Exodus 32: 1-14

The Golden Calf

When the people saw that Moses delayed to come down from the mountain, the people gathered around Aaron and said to him, 'Come, make gods for us, who shall go before us; as for this Moses, the man who brought us up out of the land of Egypt, we do not know what has become of him.' Aaron said to them, 'Take off the gold rings that are on the ears of your wives, your sons, and your daughters, and bring them to me.' So all the people took off the gold rings from their ears, and brought them to Aaron. He took the gold from them, formed it in a mould, and cast an image of a calf; and they said, 'These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!' When Aaron saw this, he built an altar before it; and Aaron made proclamation and said, 'Tomorrow shall be a festival to the LORD.' They rose early the next day, and offered burnt-offerings and brought sacrifices of well-being; and the people sat down to eat and drink, and rose up to revel. The LORD said to Moses, 'Go down at once! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshipped it and sacrificed to it, and said, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!"' The LORD said to Moses, 'I have seen this

people, how stiff-necked they are. Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them; and of you I will make a great nation.' But Moses implored the LORD his God, and said, 'O LORD, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? Why should the Egyptians say, "It was with evil intent that he brought them out to kill them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth"? Turn from your fierce wrath; change your mind and do not bring disaster on your people. Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, your servants, how you swore to them by your own self, saying to them, "I will multiply your descendants like the stars of heaven, and all this land that I have promised I will give to your descendants, and they shall inherit it for ever."' And the LORD changed his mind about the disaster that he planned to bring on his people.

Philippians 4: 1-9

Therefore, my brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, my beloved. I urge Euodia and I urge Syntyche to be of the same mind in the Lord. Yes, and I ask you also, my loyal companion, help these women, for they have struggled beside me in the work of the gospel, together with Clement and the rest of my co-workers, whose names are in the book of life.

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

St. Matthew 22: 1-14

Once more Jesus spoke to them in parables, saying: ² 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son. ³ He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet, but they would not come. ⁴ Again he sent other slaves, saying, "Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet." ⁵ But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business, ⁶ while the rest seized his slaves, maltreated them, and killed them. ⁷ The king was enraged. He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers,

and burned their city. ⁸ Then he said to his slaves, "The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. ⁹ Go therefore into the main streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet." ¹⁰ Those slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests.

¹¹ 'But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing a wedding robe, ¹² and he said to him, "Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding robe?" And he was speechless. ¹³ Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth." ¹⁴ For many are called, but few are chosen.'

Proverbs 3: 1-12

My child, do not forget my teaching, but let your heart keep my commandments; for length of days and years of life and abundant welfare they will give you. Do not let loyalty and faithfulness forsake you; bind them round your neck, write them on the tablet of your heart. So you will find favour and good repute in the sight of God and of people. Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not rely on your own insight. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths. Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the LORD, and turn away from evil. It will be a healing for your flesh and a refreshment for your body.

Honour the LORD with your substance and with the first fruits of all your produce; then your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will be bursting with wine. My child, do not despise the LORD's discipline or be weary of his reproof, for the LORD reproves the one he loves, as a father the son in whom he delights,

Philippians 1: 12-22

I want you to know, beloved, that what has happened to me has actually helped to spread the gospel, so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial guard and to everyone else that my imprisonment is for Christ; and most of the brothers and sisters, having been made confident in the Lord by my imprisonment, dare to speak the word with greater boldness and without fear. Some proclaim Christ from envy and rivalry, but others from goodwill. These proclaim

Christ out of love, knowing that I have been put here for the defence of the gospel; the others proclaim Christ out of selfish ambition, not sincerely but intending to increase my suffering in my imprisonment. What does it matter? Just this, that Christ is proclaimed in every way, whether out of false motives or true; and in that I rejoice. Yes, and I will continue to rejoice, for I know that through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will result in my deliverance. It is my eager expectation and hope that I will not be put to shame in any way, but that by my speaking with all boldness, Christ will be exalted now as always in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me, living is Christ and dying is gain. If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labour for me; and I do not know which I prefer.

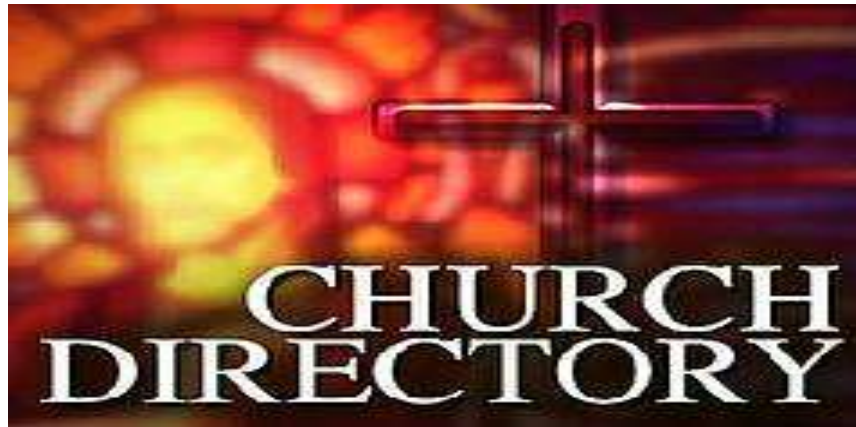
Service information

 - Hearing Aid Loop available - please turn to the T position on your hearing aid.

 - Ramp for access to the Sanctuary (on the right side)
 - Special chairs are available from the Pulpit side for those with disabilities or back problems. Note that the leg height can be adjusted to suit.
