Dear Cathedralites

What a stunning man Dr Patrick Sookhdeo is. Patrick was converted from Islam to Christianity. He knows so much about both religions. He is a prolific writer and I can recommend his latest two books "The new Civic Religion" and his latest "The death of Western Christianity" with a foreword by Lord Cherry, former Archbishop of Canterbury. One of his greatest concerns is the treatment of Christians throughout the world as they are increasingly tortured. He regards humanism as the new civic religion to be the most dangerous of beliefs. I quote "Since the second world war western societies have been undergoing a transformation." From societies founded on biblical principles in resting on a Christian foundation, they are changing to societies resting on humanism and a civic religion with its own theology, ideology and morality. This has resulted in the gradual erosion not just of faith but also of Christian moral bases"

My thanks to Father Steve for presenting so well the second Growth point in our series; that of 'Functionality'.

Today is our third in the four week series. Our theme being the call to be 'God honouring'. The mid-week meeting for those interested has been a great success and very illuminating. The smaller groups have enabled the quiet people to express their opinions. Thanks for this .

Joshua 22: 1-6

22 Then Joshua summoned the Reubenites, the Gadites, and the half-tribe of Manasseh, ² and said to them, 'You have observed all that Moses the servant of the LORD commanded you, and have obeyed me in all that I have commanded you; ³ you have not forsaken your kindred these many days, down to this day, but have been careful to keep the charge of the LORD your God. ⁴ And now the LORD your God has given rest to your kindred, as he promised them; therefore turn and go to your tents in the land where your possession lies, which Moses the servant of the LORD gave you on the other side of the Jordan. ⁵ Take good care to observe the commandment and instruction that Moses the servant of the LORD commanded you, to love the LORD your God, to walk in all his ways, to keep his commandments, and to hold fast to him, and to serve him with all your heart and with all your soul.' ⁶ So Joshua blessed them and sent them away, and they went to their tents.

¹² Indeed, all who want to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted. ¹³ But wicked people and impostors will go from bad to worse, deceiving others and being deceived. ¹⁴ But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, ¹⁵ and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings

that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus.

¹⁶ All scripture is inspired by God and is^[a] useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷ so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.

St. John 15: 1-11

15 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. ² He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes^[a] to make it bear more fruit. ³ You have already been cleansed^[b] by the word that I have spoken to you. ⁴ Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. ⁵ I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. ⁷ If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸ My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become^[c] my disciples. ⁹ As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. ¹¹ I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.


Service information

Those receiving Holy Communion are invited to do so EITHER by intinction, i.e. retaining the wafer when it is given to you and then dipping it in the cup of wine before consuming it OR by consuming the wafer when it is given to you and then drinking from the common cup.

- Grape juice is available at communion.
 - Gluten free wafers are available.
 - Hearing Aid Loop available - please turn to the T position on your hearing aid.

- Three individual speakers on the Pulpit side in rows 4 and 5.
 - Ramp for access to the Sanctuary (on the right side)
 - Special chairs are available from the Pulpit side for those with disabilities or back problems. Note that the leg height can be adjusted to suit.
