Dear Cathedralites

Happy Father's Day. The number of men attending Anglican churches in the past 20 years has declined so today it is important that here in the Cathedral the men are given a special gift to mark that Father's Day.

It was great to meet up with Karen and Zane Elliott at the Deanery. They are heading off with their children to Jakarta to do ministry there. Indonesia is over 90% Muslim and the Christian church has a vital role to play in society. I am delighted that we are forming a relationship with the Elliott family; after all, their extended family are part of the Cathedral. I look forward to your support of them as well.

I had a grand time with Beatrice who is part of a support group for those suffering head injuries. It was a privilege to sit and listen to their stories of both frustration and relief. We had a good old singalong to the 1960's songs.

Yesterday I was part of the service at Anzac Park with the merchant navy and their commemoration service. Yesterday at the Wood, Patsy and I led a service which quite a few ex- Cathedralites attended. It was good to catch up with them too.

September is going to be a pretty frenetic month here at the cathedral. Next Sunday we hope to have a South American influence because the Argentinians are playing the All Blacks at Trafalgar Park. There is a wonderful Gloria which comes from Peru so we're hoping to sing that. Please come 5 minutes early so you can learn it. I know you'll enjoy it.

The following Sunday, the 16th, we'll be staging "The Pilgrim's Progress" as part of the 10 o'clock service and repeating it again at 3 o'clock. We will of course also have the 5.30 pm Evensong and the 7 o'clock Word and Worship.

It's been enjoyable having our friend and colleague the Revd. Craig Dixon staying with us earlier in the week. Craig orchestrates a food co-op in Christchurch. He buys \$90,000.00 worth of vegetables every week. He is an amazing entrepreneur and committed Christian.

Also with us later on in the week we have our great friends Anne and Mark Larsen. Mark heads up the Christian Schools network. He has great expertise in this. He is former principal of Middleton Grange. We both were at university together just a few years ago! It's great to belong to a Christian community where we can catch up with folks from yesteryear and enjoy each other's company.

Today's Gospel reading reminds us of the great problem of hypocrisy. Jesus railed against the scribes and Pharisees for them sweating the small stuff and overlooking the big picture. May we not fall into the same trap.

⁸The voice of my beloved! Look, he comes, leaping upon the mountains, bounding over the hills. ⁹My beloved is like a gazelle or a young stag. Look, there he stands behind our wall, gazing in at the windows, looking through the lattice. ¹⁰My beloved speaks and says to me: 'Arise, my love, my fair one, and come away;

¹¹for now the winter is past, the rain is over and gone. ¹²The flowers appear on the earth; the time of singing has come, and the voice of the turtle-dove is heard in our land. ¹³The fig tree puts forth its figs, and the vines are in blossom; they give forth fragrance. Arise, my love, my fair one, and come away.

James 1:19-27

¹⁹You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger; ²⁰for your anger does not produce God's righteousness. ²¹Therefore rid yourselves of all sordidness and rank growth of wickedness, and welcome with meekness the implanted word that has the power to save your souls. ²²But be doers of the word, and not merely hearers who deceive themselves. ²³For if any are hearers of the word and not doers, they are like those who look at themselves in a

mirror; ²⁴for they look at themselves and, on going away, immediately forget what they were like. ²⁵But those who look into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and persevere, being not hearers who forget but doers who act—they will be blessed in their doing. ²⁶If any think they are religious, and do not bridle their tongues but deceive their hearts, their religion is worthless. ²⁷Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to care for orphans and widows in their distress, and to keep oneself unstained by the world.

Mark 7:1-8, 14,15

¹Now when the Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around him, ²they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with defiled hands, that is, without washing them. ³(For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, do not eat unless they thoroughly wash their hands, thus observing the tradition of the


elders; ⁴and they do not eat anything from the market unless they wash it; and there are also many other traditions that they observe, the washing of cups, pots, and bronze kettles.) ⁵So the Pharisees and the scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not live according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?' ⁶He said to them,

'Isaiah prophesied rightly about you hypocrites, as it is written, "This people honours me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; ⁷ in vain do they worship me, teaching human precepts as doctrines." ⁸ You abandon the commandment of God and hold to

human tradition.' ¹⁴ Then he called the crowd again and said to them, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand: ¹⁵ there is nothing outside a person that by going in can defile, but the things that come out are what defile.'

Psalm 119:1-16

- 1 Blessed are those whose way is blameless: who walk in the law of the Lord.
- 2 Blessed are those who keep his commands: and seek Him with their whole heart;
- 3 Those who do no wrong: but walk in the ways of our God.
- 4 For you O Lord have commanded us: to persevere in all your precepts.
- 5 If only my ways were unerring: towards the keeping of your statutes!
- 6 Then I should not be ashamed: when I looked on all your commandments.
- 7 I will praise you with sincerity of heart: as I learn your righteous judgements.
- 8 I will keep your statutes: O forsake me no utterly.
- 9 How shall a young man's path be pure: unless he keep to your word?
- 10 I have sought you with my whole heart: let me know stray from your commandments.
- 11 I have treasured your words in my heart: that I might not sin against you.
- 12 Blessed are you Lord God: O teach me your statutes.
- 13 With my lips I have been telling: all the judgements of your mouth;
- 14 And I find more joy in the way of your commands: that in all manner of riches.
- 15 I will meditate on your precepts: and give heed to your ways'
- 16 For my delight is wholly in your statutes: and I will not forget your word.



Exodus 12:21-28

²¹ Then Moses called all the elders of Israel and said to them, 'Go, select lambs for your families, and slaughter the passover lamb. ²² Take a bunch of hyssop, dip it in the blood that is in the basin, and touch the lintel and the two doorposts with the blood in the basin. None of you shall go outside the door of your house until morning. ²³ For the LORD will pass through to strike down the Egyptians; when he sees the blood on the lintel and on the two doorposts, the LORD will pass over that door and will not allow the destroyer to enter your houses to strike you down. ²⁴ You shall observe

this rite as a perpetual ordinance for you and your children. ²⁵ When you come to the land that the LORD will give you, as he has promised, you shall keep this observance. ²⁶ And when your children ask you, "What do you mean by this observance?" ²⁷ you shall say, "It is the passover sacrifice to the LORD, for he passed over the houses of the Israelites in Egypt, when he struck down the Egyptians but spared our houses.'" And the people bowed down and worshipped. ²⁸ The Israelites went and did just as the LORD had commanded Moses and Aaron.

Matthew 5:1-16

¹ When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. ² Then he began to speak, and taught them, saying: ³ 'Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. ⁴ 'Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. ⁵ 'Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. ⁶ 'Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. ⁷ 'Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy. ⁸ 'Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. ⁹ 'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. ¹⁰ 'Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. ¹¹ 'Blessed are you when people revile

you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. ¹² Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you. ¹³ 'You are the salt of the earth; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything, but is thrown out and trampled under foot. ¹⁴ 'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden. ¹⁵ No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.
