Dear Cathedralites

It's been an exciting week in the life of Nelson as the All Blacks and Argentinians and subsequent supporters have invaded our great city. I am hopeful that a number will be here at our services today. And so a warm welcome to both All Black supporters and Argentinian supporters. To that end we are going to sing the Gloria in our 10 o'clock service which has a South American flavour. It actually comes from Peru! So I look forward to all of us singing this special Gloria on this particular weekend.

I didn't know whether to laugh or cry when I read the headlines of the Dominion on Monday about Bible in Schools. The article congratulated Khandallah for handling the Bible in Schools saga so well. They said: "The Khandallah school refused to talk about Jesus, only about the ethics"! To take Jesus away from ethics is to rip-out most of the gospels, and to ignore them. After all, that's where ethics come from. Take the Sermon on the Mount for example and Jesus' command to 'love God, your neighbour and yourself'. I am lost for words as to how ridiculous it is getting here in New Zealand.

To this is the woman from Phoenicia in today's Gospel reading who falls at the feet of Jesus even though she was an absolute non-believer in Him at the start. You'll see in the other parts of the bulletin where Syrophoenicia is. It is very significant as this was a non-Jewish region. So once again, Jesus is for all people, Jews and Gentiles alike. He was then and he is now.

David Jack has been working hard with his team for Pilgrim's Progress which will be staged next Sunday at our 10 o'clock service and another performance at 3 o'clock. Come early for the 10 o'clock service as David can take us through some of the music that we will be singing.

There was a disturbing article in the Nelson Mail last Saturday about loneliness. To that end I am very keen that we re-establish the living alone group. We may call it 'alone together'. But whatever the name, I am keen to relaunch it here at the Cathedral. Perhaps it will be once a month on a Friday from 1 till 2.30. This will include a light meal. If you are interested in this amazingly important ministry then please send me an email or phone me. This is going to be an increasing problem in this region, and I want the Cathedral to be at the forefront at addressing it, thus providing a place for folk to come together in fellowship.

Congratulations to Paddy and Francis Day, well known entities in Nelson, who celebrated their 50<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary recently. They have been wonderful servants to this region. Make sure you sign the card, so we can send it to them from all of us at the Cathedral.

## Proverbs 22: 1-2, 8-9 22-23

<sup>1</sup> A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches, and favour is better than silver or gold. <sup>2</sup> The rich and the poor have this in common: the LORD is the maker of them all. <sup>8</sup> Whoever sows injustice will reap calamity, and the rod of anger will fail. <sup>9</sup> Those who are

generous are blessed, for they share their bread with the poor. <sup>22</sup> Do not rob the poor because they are poor, or crush the afflicted at the gate; <sup>23</sup> for the LORD pleads their cause and despoils of life those who despoil them.

## James 2: 1 -10

<sup>1</sup> My brothers and sisters, do you with your acts of favouritism really believe in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ? <sup>2</sup> For if a person with gold rings and in fine clothes comes into your assembly, and if a poor person in dirty clothes also comes in, <sup>3</sup> and if you take notice of the one wearing the fine clothes and say, 'Have a seat here, please', while to the one who is poor you say, 'Stand there', or, 'Sit at my feet', <sup>4</sup> have you not made distinctions among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts? <sup>5</sup> Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. Has not God chosen the poor in the world to be rich

in faith and to be heirs of the kingdom that he has promised to those who love him? <sup>6</sup> But you have dishonoured the poor. Is it not the rich who oppress you? Is it not they who drag you into court? <sup>7</sup> Is it not they who blaspheme the excellent name that was invoked over you? <sup>8</sup> You do well if you really fulfil the royal law according to the scripture, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' <sup>9</sup> But if you show partiality, you commit sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. <sup>10</sup> For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it.

## Mark 7: 24-30

<sup>24</sup> From there he set out and went away to the region of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice, <sup>25</sup> but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, and she came and bowed down at his feet. <sup>26</sup> Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophoenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her

daughter. <sup>27</sup> He said to her, 'Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs.' <sup>28</sup> But she answered him, 'Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs.' <sup>29</sup> Then he said to her, 'For saying that, you may go—the demon has left your daughter.' <sup>30</sup> So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, and the demon gone.

### Psalm 119: 41-56

41. Let your loving mercy come to me O lord: and you salvation according to your word.
42. Then I shall have an answer for those who reproach me: for I trust in your word.
43. Do not take the word of truth utterly out of my mouth: for in your judgements is my hope.
44. Let me keep your law continually: O let me keep it for ever.
45. And so I shall walk at liberty: because I have sought your precepts.
46. I shall speak of your commands before kings: and shall not be put to shame.
47. My delight shall be in your commandments; which I have greatly loved.
48. I shall worship you with outstretched hands: and I shall meditate of your statutes.
49. Remember your word to your servant: on which you have built my hope.
50. This has been my comfort in my affliction: for your word has brought me life.
51. Though the proud have laughed me to scorn: I have not turned aside from your law;
52. But I called to mind O Lord your judgements of old and in them I have found consolation.
53. I am seized with indignation at the wicked: for they have forsaken your law.
54. But your statutes have become my songs: in the house of my pilgrimage.
55. I think on your name O Lord in the night: and I observe your law;
56. This has been my reward: because I have kept your precepts.

### Exodus 14: 15-31

<sup>15</sup> Then the LORD said to Moses, 'Why do you cry out to me? Tell the Israelites to go forward. <sup>16</sup> But you lift up your staff, and stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it, that the Israelites may go into the sea on dry ground. <sup>17</sup> Then I will harden the hearts of the Egyptians so that they will go in after them; and so I will gain glory for myself over Pharaoh and all his army, his chariots, and his chariot drivers. <sup>18</sup> And the Egyptians shall know that I am the LORD, when I have gained glory for myself over Pharaoh, his chariots, and his chariot drivers.'

<sup>19</sup> The angel of God who was going before the Israelite army moved and went behind them; and the pillar of cloud moved from in front of them and took its place behind them. <sup>20</sup> It came between the army of Egypt and the army of Israel. And so the cloud was there with the darkness, and it lit up the night; one did not come near the other all night. <sup>21</sup> Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea. The LORD drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night, and turned the sea into dry land; and the waters were divided. <sup>22</sup> The Israelites went

into the sea on dry ground, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left. <sup>23</sup> The Egyptians pursued, and went into the sea after them, all of Pharaoh's horses, chariots, and chariot drivers. <sup>24</sup> At the morning watch the LORD in the pillar of fire and cloud looked down upon the Egyptian army, and threw the Egyptian army into panic. <sup>25</sup> He clogged their chariot wheels so that they turned with difficulty. The Egyptians said, 'Let us flee from the Israelites, for the LORD is fighting for them against Egypt.' <sup>26</sup> Then the LORD said to Moses, 'Stretch out your hand over the sea, so that the water may come back upon the Egyptians, upon their chariots and chariot drivers.' <sup>27</sup> So Moses stretched

out his hand over the sea, and at dawn the sea returned to its normal depth. As the Egyptians fled before it, the LORD tossed the Egyptians into the sea. <sup>28</sup> The waters returned and covered the chariots and the chariot drivers, the entire army of Pharaoh that had followed them into the sea; not one of them remained. <sup>29</sup> But the Israelites walked on dry ground through the sea, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left. <sup>30</sup> Thus the LORD saved Israel that day from the Egyptians; and Israel saw the Egyptians dead on the seashore. <sup>31</sup> Israel saw the great work that the LORD did against the Egyptians. So the people feared the LORD and believed in the LORD and in his servant Moses.

#### Matthew 6: 1-18

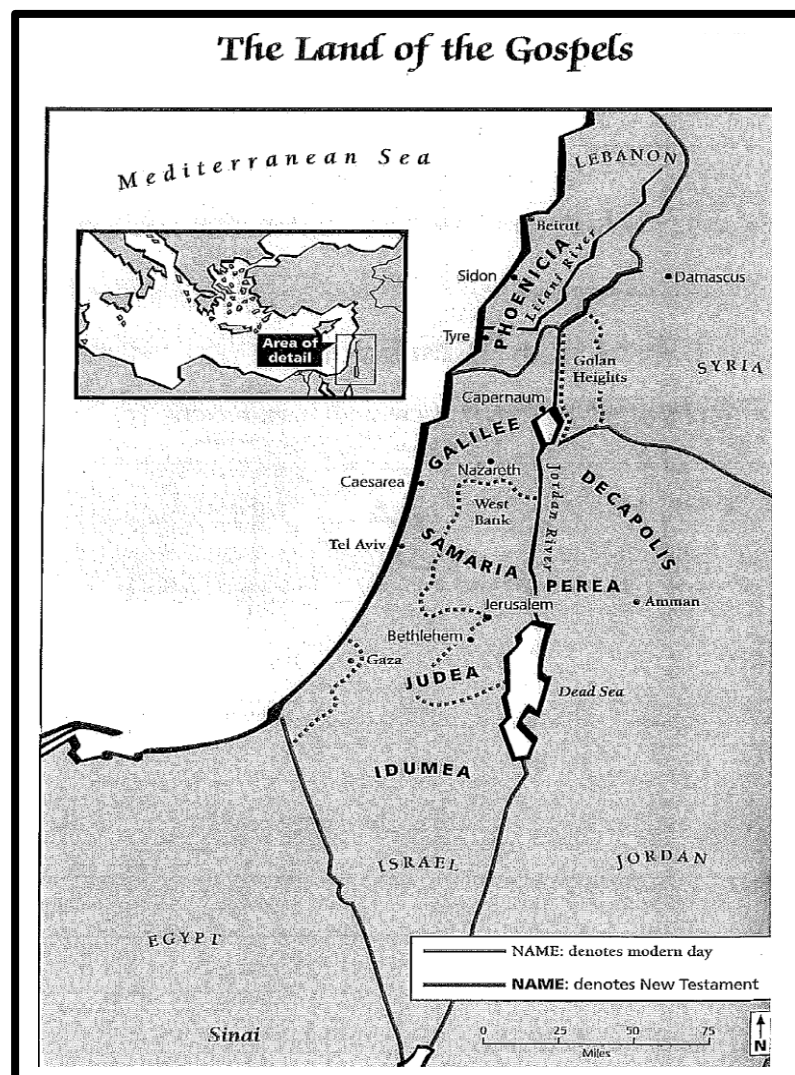
<sup>1</sup> 'Beware of practising your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven. <sup>2</sup> 'So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. <sup>3</sup> But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, <sup>4</sup> so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you. <sup>5</sup> 'And whenever you pray, do not be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, so that they may be

seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. <sup>6</sup> But whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you. <sup>7</sup> 'When you are praying, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do; for they think that they will be heard because of their many words. <sup>8</sup> Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him. <sup>9</sup> 'Pray then in this way: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. <sup>10</sup> Your kingdom come. Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. <sup>11</sup> Give us this day our daily bread. <sup>12</sup> And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.



<sup>13</sup> And do not bring us to the time of trial, but rescue us from the evil one.  
<sup>14</sup> For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you; <sup>15</sup> but if you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses. <sup>16</sup> 'And whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure

their faces so as to show others that they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. <sup>17</sup> But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, <sup>18</sup> so that your fasting may be seen not by others but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.
