Dear Cathedralites,

Thursday was Ascension Day but we continue that celebration this Sunday morning. Ascension follows the drama of Easter and then is followed by the drama of Pentecost. While not sitting equally in-between, it is still a time at Ascension where the disciples started to regroup to hope and believe again following the promise of Jesus that upon leaving them He would give them the Holy Spirit.

Today, besides being Ascension Day, is also the three Tikanga celebration and to that end we welcome Archdeacon Harvey Ruru from Tikanga Maori and the Revd. Tapita Ching who is from Tikanga Pasifica (but who is ordained within Tikanga Maori). In 1992, the General Synod adopted a revised constitution to provide an opportunity for each of the three partners, Maori, Pakeha and Pasifica, to express its mind as an equal partner in the decision-making process of General Synod and to exercise mission and ministry to God's people within the culture of each partner. So New Zealand is unique in that we have three strands to our Anglican church, one tikanga Maori, one tikanga Pakeha and one tikanga Pasifica. One of the driving reasons why tikanga Maori wanted this revised constitution was so that they could worship in their own language and sing in their own language. They are the ones who requested the separation, not Pakeha. We are very fortunate in this Cathedral to have representatives from each of the three Tikanga and today we celebrate that. So it is right and proper that we should have tikanga Maori and Pasifica clergy and lay people to have a say in the sort of music and prayers in our 10 am service. Some may not be familiar to you; you might not even find them helpful in your worship. However, this is the reality of living in a cosmopolitan nation. It is not about us being comfortable. In fact, Bishop-elect Steve Maina says that whenever a church is comfortable in its present state, it is probably missing out on the next generation. So, on this Ascension Sunday and three Tikanga Sunday we especially welcome Archdeacon Harvey Ruru and the Revd. Tapita Ching to our 10 am service as we express the three tikanga started about 27 years ago.

Next Sunday is Pentecost and wouldn't it be great if we all wore something red to acknowledge the wonderful day of the Church's first birthday. We may even find a prize or two for the most red-clad person!

We will also be having a special morning tea following the 10 am service to help John Laing on his way to Brazil, where he will be undertaking a mission which will see him visiting prisons and others who need to know and experience a relationship with Jesus! An exciting time for him.

When I first came here, two and a half years ago, I noticed that people would often ring up the parish office to find out phone numbers and email addresses, so I asked Angela and Ron Shaw and Helen McKenzie to compile an informal directory. This is not a roll; it is simply a directory of anyone in the Cathedral willing to supply their name, email address and phone number and to have it collated into a booklet for easy access. Well, two years later, we need to update it. I invite you over the next month to review the details and to correct them, if necessary. In an age of isolation, it is so important to have access to each other's contact details.

CAMEO is on again on Friday 7<sup>th</sup> June from 1 to 2.30 pm. I am excited because I see people come and enjoy the fellowship of those around them. Please bring someone whom you know would really appreciate time out with others. They don't have to belong to the Cathedral, of course.

This morning we will concentrate on the amazing Ascension. Tonight at 5.30 pm I will be preaching on Ephesians 4, which talks about church order in the form of the five-fold ministries of apostle, prophet, evangelist, pastor and teacher. You will see elsewhere in the Bulletin a picture of a hand which illustrates it quite well. Tonight at 7 pm we will have a special testimony from a woman who has had an amazing set of experiences in her life.

It is lovely for Patsy and me to celebrate my friend's 65<sup>th</sup> birthday. Mark and Ann Larsen often frequent the Nelson region in their campervan and join us at services in the Cathedral. They have been lifelong friends of us.

I will do an interview with a Bishopdale Theological student on the three imperatives of belong, believe and behave. The latest theory is that belonging in a day of isolation and loneliness pre-empts both believing and behaving when it comes to the Christian faith. However, others demand that belief is the pre-requisite and comes first, followed by behaving and belonging, while the third group believe that behaving right is the most important. I wonder what you think. Have a great week.

### Deuteronomy 34:1-8

<sup>1</sup> Then Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo, to the top of Pisgah, which is opposite Jericho, and the LORD showed him the whole land: Gilead as far as Dan, <sup>2</sup> all Naphtali, the land of Ephraim and Manasseh, all the land of Judah as far as the Western Sea, <sup>3</sup> the Negeb, and the Plain—that is, the valley of Jericho, the city of palm trees—as far as Zoar. <sup>4</sup> The LORD said to him, ‘This is the land of which I swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, saying, “I will give it to your descendants”; I have let you see it with your eyes, but you shall not cross over there.’ <sup>5</sup> Then

Moses, the servant of the LORD, died there in the land of Moab, at the LORD’s command. <sup>6</sup> He was buried in a valley in the land of Moab, opposite Beth-peor, but no one knows his burial place to this day. <sup>7</sup> Moses was one hundred and twenty years old when he died; his sight was unimpaired and his vigour had not abated. <sup>8</sup> The Israelites wept for Moses in the plains of Moab for thirty days; then the period of mourning for Moses was ended.

### Acts 1:1-11

<sup>1</sup> In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning <sup>2</sup> until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. <sup>3</sup> After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them over the course of forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. <sup>4</sup> While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. ‘This’, he said, ‘is what you have heard from me; <sup>5</sup> for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.’ <sup>6</sup> So when they had come together, they asked him, ‘Lord, is this

the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?’ <sup>7</sup> He replied, ‘It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. <sup>8</sup> But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.’ <sup>9</sup> When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. <sup>10</sup> While he was going and they were gazing up towards heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. <sup>11</sup> They said, ‘Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up towards heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.’

<sup>44</sup> Then he said to them, 'These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled.' <sup>45</sup> Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, <sup>46</sup> and he said to them, 'Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, <sup>47</sup> and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. <sup>48</sup> You are witnesses of

things. <sup>49</sup> And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high.' <sup>50</sup> Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. <sup>51</sup> While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. <sup>52</sup> And they worshipped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; <sup>53</sup> and they were continually in the temple blessing God.

<sup>7</sup> But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. <sup>8</sup> Therefore it is said, 'When he ascended on high he made captivity itself a captive; he gave gifts to his people.'<sup>9</sup> (When it says, 'He ascended', what does it mean but that he had also descended into the lower parts of the earth?<sup>10</sup> He who descended is the same one who ascended far above all the heavens, so that he might fill all things.)<sup>11</sup> The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers,<sup>12</sup> to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ,<sup>13</sup> until

to come? Let them tell us what is yet to be.<sup>8</sup> Do not fear, or be afraid; have I not told you from of old and declared it? You are my witnesses! Is there any god besides me? There is no other rock; I know not one.

all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ.<sup>14</sup> We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine, by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming.<sup>15</sup> But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ,<sup>16</sup> from whom the whole body, joined and knitted together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.

## **THE MIGHTY HAND OF GOD**


The human hand can illustrate the Five-fold ministry

The forefinger represents the **Prophet** - The forefinger is referred to as the one that points. The ministry of the prophet is of divine and anointing that points the way for the Body of Christ.

The Middle finger represents the **Evangelist** - The middle finger extends the furthest on the hand. The middle finger represents the outreach ministry extended to the evangelization of the entire world.

The ring finger represents the **Pastor** - This is the finger that the wedding ring goes on. The Pastor is married to the sheep.

The thumb represents the **Apostle** - please take note that the thumb can touch and minister to all four fingers.



The little finger represents the **Teacher** - Though the little finger is the smallest, it provides balance to the hand.
