Dear Cathedralites,

Pentecost is widely regarded as the birthday of the church. So today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday in a number of different ways. Firstly, we are wearing red. Red is the symbol of the flame. The two great symbols of Pentecost are wind and flame. The sight and the sound of Pentecost are well recorded in the book of Acts as the Holy Spirit fell on hundreds of people and their lives were transformed. In today's Eucharistic services there will be a chance for you to be once again anointed with oil and receive an in-filling with the Holy Spirit.

Another part of our Pentecost celebrations is the chance for us to encourage John Laing as he heads off to Brazil for a couple of weeks next month on mission work. He will be visiting prisons as well as working alongside children. After today's 10 o'clock service there will be a chance to have our \$5.00 purchases of food, the money of which will go towards his mission.

Also, on this Pentecost day we celebrate the fact that Russell Smith is back with us for a farewell. Russell and Debby recently shifted up to Waverley to be near their family. Russell is back to say farewell. He has been a member of the Cathedral congregation for the best part of twenty years and has had an amazing ministry in this Cathedral. He has been a member of the Parish Vestry, Cathedral Council and latterly Cathedral Vestry continuously for over sixteen years. He held the position of Treasurer for many those years and was at different times a Synod Representative, Dean's Warden, and latterly a Lay Canon. Russell is an enthusiastic supporter of missions and has written a few books, and at present is writing one on the history of the Anglican Mission Board. As a Cathedral, I want to thank Russell for his wonderful ministry amongst us. I wish him well in the mission field in the Diocese of Taranaki/ Waikato.

It is grand to see that Nigel Weeks was awarded a QSM in this year's Queen's Birthday honours list. Nigel, amongst all his other musical pursuits, is a choir member at our 5.30 pm Choral Evensong. Congratulations, Nigel. Also, congratulations to Gloria Lee who won a recent competition for the best organist in New Zealand.

Yesterday we had the funeral for Mrs. Margaret Meffan. The Meffans have been members of the Cathedral for many years and have played significant roles. The service featured a number of musical tributes from the family. Margaret inspired many of them to enjoy classical music.

Next Saturday at 10 am at the Deanery Kirsten Cant is coming to speak about her role in missions. I have been asked to host this meeting by Lois Mills who heads up the branch of the Nelson Church Missionary Society. Come and join us over a muffin and a natter, regarding missions.

The AAW have been practising some singing and skits for next Sunday afternoon's AAW party. Make sure you came and join us for this joyful occasion. There is nothing like a good mid-winter party.

May this be a special Pentecost for those interested in the pursuit of Christian communities. They have been inspired by what happened at Pentecost. We read in the end of Acts of how members came together to share their belongings, meet regularly and did life together. Recently, Greg, the vicar of Victory Church announced his intention to move towards such a community. Years ago, out at Ngatimoti, the Newtons ran a very effective Christian community. Here in Nelson there is a Catholic community as well. There is a hankering to relive those early days of Christianity with the establishment of a more common living experience and of sharing together much more than we do today in our individualised society. Belonging is so important these days.

Thanks so much for those who made our last CAMEO such a success as people from all around came and shared a little in this new community.

I see we snuck home against Bangladesh in the world cricket cup. Plans are underway for a sports service in the Cathedral later on in the year.

Amen.**

Genesis 11:1-9

¹ Now the whole earth had one language and the same words. ²And as they migrated from the east, they came upon a plain in the land of Shinar and settled there. ³And they said to one another, "Come, let us make bricks, and burn them thoroughly." And they had brick for stone, and bitumen for mortar. ⁴Then they said, "Come, let us build ourselves a city, and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves; otherwise we shall be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth." ⁵The LORD came down to see the city and the tower, which mortals had built. ⁶And

the LORD said, "Look, they are one people, and they have all one language; and this is only the beginning of what they will do; nothing that they propose to do will now be impossible for them. ⁷Come, let us go down, and confuse their language there, so that they will not understand one another's speech." ⁸So the LORD scattered them abroad from there over the face of all the earth, and they left off building the city. ⁹Therefore it was called Babel, because there the LORD confused the language of all the earth; and from there the LORD scattered them abroad over the face of all the earth.

Acts 2:1-12

¹When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. ⁵Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the

native language of each. ⁷Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans?" ⁸And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? ⁹Parthians, Medes, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, ¹¹Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." ¹²All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?"

John 14:8-17, 25-27

⁸ Philip said to him, "Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied." ⁹ Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'?" ¹⁰ Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. ¹¹ Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. ¹² Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. ¹³ I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. ¹⁴ If in my name you ask me for

anything, I will do it. ¹⁵ "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. ¹⁶ And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. ¹⁷ This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you. ²⁵ "I have said these things to you while I am still with you. ²⁶ But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. ²⁷ Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid.

Psalms 33:1-12

1. Rejoice in the Lord you righteous: for it benefits the just to praise Him.
2. Give the Lord thanks upon the harp: and sing His praise to the lute of ten strings.
3. O sing him a new song: make sweetest melody with shouts of praise.
4. For the word of the Lord is true: and all his works are faithful.
5. He loves righteousness and justice: the earth is filled with the loving-kindness of the Lord.
6. By the word of the Lord were heavens made: and their numberless stars by the breath of his mouth.
7. He gathered the waters of the sea as in a water-skin: and laid up the deep in his treasuries.
8. Let the whole earth fear the Lord: and let all the inhabitants of the world stand in awe of Him.
9. For He spoke and it was done: He commanded and it stood fast.
10. The Lord frustrates the counsels of the nations: He brings to nothing the devices of the peoples.
11. But the counsels of the Lord shall endure for ever: the purposes of his heart from generation to generation.
12. Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord: the people He chose to be His own possession.

Exodus 33:7-20

⁷ Now Moses used to take the tent and pitch it outside the camp, far off from the camp; he called it the tent of meeting. And everyone who sought the LORD would go out to the tent of meeting, which was outside the camp. ⁸ Whenever Moses went out to the tent, all the people would rise and stand, each of them, at the entrance of their tents and watch Moses until he had gone into the tent. ⁹ When Moses entered the tent, the pillar of cloud would descend and stand at the entrance of the tent, and the LORD would speak with Moses. ¹⁰ When all the people saw the pillar of cloud standing at the entrance of the tent, all the people would rise and bow down, all of them, at the entrance of their tent. ¹¹ Thus the LORD used to speak to Moses face to face, as one speaks to a friend. Then he would return to the camp; but his young assistant, Joshua son of Nun, would not leave the tent. ¹² Moses said to the LORD, "See, you have said to me, 'Bring up this people'; but you have not let me know whom you will send with me. Yet you have said, 'I know you by

name, and you have also found favour in my sight.' ¹³ Now if I have found favour in your sight, show me your ways, so that I may know you and find favour in your sight. Consider too that this nation is your people." ¹⁴ He said, "My presence will go with you, and I will give you rest." ¹⁵ And he said to him, "If your presence will not go, do not carry us up from here. ¹⁶ For how shall it be known that I have found favour in your sight, I and your people, unless you go with us? In this way, we shall be distinct, I and your people, from every people on the face of the earth." ¹⁷ The LORD said to Moses, "I will do the very thing that you have asked; for you have found favour in my sight, and I know you by name." ¹⁸ Moses said, "Show me your glory, I pray." ¹⁹ And he said, "I will make all my goodness pass before you, and will proclaim before you the name, 'The LORD'; and I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and will show mercy on whom I will show mercy. ²⁰ But," he said, "you cannot see my face; for no one shall see me and live."

Acts 2:37-47

³⁷ Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and to the other apostles, "Brothers, what should we do?" ³⁸ Peter said to them, "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that

your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. ³⁹ For the promise is for you, for your children, and for all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to him." ⁴⁰ And he testified with many

other arguments and exhorted them, saying, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." ⁴¹So those who welcomed his message were baptized, and that day about three thousand persons were added. ⁴²They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. ⁴³Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. ⁴⁴All who believed were

together and had all things in common; ⁴⁵they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. ⁴⁶Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, ⁴⁷praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.
