Dear Cathedralites

Can I add chips to that? Can I add drinks to that? These 'add-ons' have become a reality as we go out for a meal these days. We decide on the main meal and then blow me down, the waiter comes, and having accepted the order and will then make this great offer. Will you have chips, drinks, etc. – 'add-ons'? While this might make me smile at the marketing exercise, it certainly did not make St Paul smile. Because 'add-ons' is what visiting preachers were doing to the basic Gospel of Jesus Christ. For them, Jesus Christ was not enough; they had to 'add on'. Other things, such as the insistence of being circumcised, the insistence to refrain from certain meals, and to celebrate certain festivals, infuriated Paul because it was in danger of either diluting or subjugating the basic message of Jesus Christ. Our epistle reading this morning from Colossians is regarded by some as the purest sort of Christology ever written.

It was with great sadness that we learned of Tom Allen's death this week. We remember his parents and family, Graham, Dean's warden, and Jean in our prayers following this tragic loss of a son. His funeral was held in the Cathedral on Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> July.

Rev. John White spent some time in intensive care this week.

I am thankful for the number of Cathedral clergy who ensure that our eleven services every week are held.

Last night, a number of us would have been at tables for eight. I look forward to the stories of fun and laughter at each of the places we went to. It is a great way of getting to know each other from other congregations within the cathedral.

This week I head out to Ernest Rutherford to take a communion service. The Cathedral clergy or Patsy also take a weekly service at the Wood as well as other places.

Every month I meet with a number of clergy in my regional deanery. It is always good to catch up with them. There will be movements of clergy from Victory church where Rev. Greg Holmes is leaving.

Rev. Emmanuel Vallaidam has shifted from Tahunanui to Atawhai Parish. Of course, everyone is looking forward to the arrival of our new Bishop Steve Maina and Watiri to the Diocese.

Wasn't the cricket incredible?! Well done on the kiwis for accepting what was actually a flawed result. (I'm not worried about it at all, but it is the reality). It will, however, see the host nation in the home of cricket being able to celebrate their first ever World Cup victory. It was wonderful to see how the New Zealand team accepted the result.

Well, beware of 'add-ons', be it in your meal or in your Christian life.

- Special chairs are available from the Pulpit side for those with disabilities or back problems. Note that the leg height can be adjusted to suit.

**HEALTH ADVISORY NOTICE:** Worshippers experiencing Cold or Influenza-like illnesses or associated symptoms are advised to refrain from partaking of the practice of "Intinction" with the wafer or using the "Common Cup" during the communion ceremony. Clearly labelled wine and fruit juice alternatives are provided utilising the small thimble glasses. ### Amos 8:1-7

<sup>1</sup> This is what the Lord GOD showed me—a basket of summer fruit. <sup>2</sup> He said, “Amos, what do you see?” And I said, “A basket of summer fruit.” Then the LORD said to me, “The end has come upon my people Israel; I will never again pass them by. <sup>3</sup> The songs of the temple shall become wailings in that day,” says the Lord GOD; “the dead bodies shall be many, cast out in every place. Be silent!” <sup>4</sup> Hear this, you that trample on the needy, and bring

### Colossians 1:15-28

<sup>15</sup> He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; <sup>16</sup> for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. <sup>17</sup> He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. <sup>18</sup> He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. <sup>19</sup> For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, <sup>20</sup> and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross. <sup>21</sup> And you who were once estranged and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, <sup>22</sup> he has now reconciled in his fleshly body through death, so as to present you holy and blameless and irreproachable before him—

to ruin the poor of the land, <sup>5</sup> saying, “When will the new moon be over so that we may sell grain; and the sabbath, so that we may offer wheat for sale? We will make the ephah small and the shekel great, and practice deceit with false balances, <sup>6</sup> buying the poor for silver and the needy for a pair of sandals, and selling the sweepings of the wheat.” <sup>7</sup> The LORD has sworn by the pride of Jacob: Surely I will never forget any of their deeds.

<sup>23</sup> provided that you continue securely established and steadfast in the faith, without shifting from the hope promised by the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven. I, Paul, became a servant of this gospel. <sup>24</sup> I am now rejoicing in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am completing what is lacking in Christ’s afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church. <sup>25</sup> I became its servant according to God’s commission that was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known, <sup>26</sup> the mystery that has been hidden throughout the ages and generations but has now been revealed to his saints. <sup>27</sup> To them God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. <sup>28</sup> It is he whom we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone in all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ.

### Luke 10:38-42

<sup>38</sup> Now as they went on their way, he entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. <sup>39</sup> She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying. <sup>40</sup> But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to him and asked, "Lord, do you not care that my

sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me." <sup>41</sup> But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; <sup>42</sup> there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her."

### Genesis 41:14-16, 25-37

<sup>14</sup> Then Pharaoh sent for Joseph, and he was hurriedly brought out of the dungeon. When he had shaved himself and changed his clothes, he came in before Pharaoh. <sup>15</sup> And Pharaoh said to Joseph, 'I have had a dream, and there is no one who can interpret it. I have heard it said of you that when you hear a dream you can interpret it.' <sup>16</sup> Joseph answered Pharaoh, 'It is not I; God will give Pharaoh a favourable answer.' <sup>25</sup> Then Joseph said to Pharaoh, 'Pharaoh's dreams are one and the same; God has revealed to Pharaoh what he is about to do. <sup>26</sup> The seven good cows are seven years, and the seven good ears are seven years; the dreams are one. <sup>27</sup> The seven lean and ugly cows that came up after them are seven years, as are the seven empty ears blighted by the east wind. They are seven years of famine. <sup>28</sup> It is as I told Pharaoh; God has shown to Pharaoh what he is about to do. <sup>29</sup> There will come seven years of great plenty throughout all the land of Egypt. <sup>30</sup> After them there will arise seven

years of famine, and all the plenty will be forgotten in the land of Egypt; the famine will consume the land. <sup>31</sup> The plenty will no longer be known in the land because of the famine that will follow, for it will be very grievous. <sup>32</sup> And the doubling of Pharaoh's dream means that the thing is fixed by God, and God will shortly bring it about. <sup>33</sup> Now therefore let Pharaoh select a man who is discerning and wise, and set him over the land of Egypt. <sup>34</sup> Let Pharaoh proceed to appoint overseers over the land, and take one-fifth of the produce of the land of Egypt during the seven plenteous years. <sup>35</sup> Let them gather all the food of these good years that are coming, and lay up grain under the authority of Pharaoh for food in the cities, and let them keep it. <sup>36</sup> That food shall be a reserve for the land against the seven years of famine that are to befall the land of Egypt, so that the land may not perish through the famine.' <sup>37</sup> The proposal pleased Pharaoh and all his servants.

## 1 Corinthians 4:8-13

<sup>8</sup>Already you have all you want! Already you have become rich! Quite apart from us you have become kings! Indeed, I wish that you had become kings, so that we might be kings with you! <sup>9</sup>For I think that God has exhibited us apostles as last of all, as though sentenced to death, because we have become a spectacle to the world, to angels and to mortals. <sup>10</sup>We are fools for the sake of Christ, but you are wise in Christ. We are weak, but you are

strong. You are held in honour, but we in disrepute. <sup>11</sup>To the present hour we are hungry and thirsty, we are poorly clothed and beaten and homeless, <sup>12</sup>and we grow weary from the work of our own hands. When reviled, we bless; when persecuted, we endure; <sup>13</sup>when slandered, we speak kindly. We have become like the rubbish of the world, the dregs of all things, to this very day.


